CFIs: both Junior & Veteran

As my CFI license was approaching renewal time I remembered that our own June Bonesteel conducted an FAA approved CFI Refresher Course. For those working on their Initial CFI it's also a CFI Oral Prep Course. I liked the idea of spending many hours reviewing a plethora of topics with other pilots verses one of the computer courses. June is a bounty full of knowledge from real world to regulations and has been an Examiner in both Fixed and Rotorcraft for many a years.

The course I took was focused on Fixed wing aircraft but she mentioned putting together a future class for the rotor folks as there were multiple in our class. Fixed or Rotor June puts together a comprehensive 2 1/2 day class for all. The limited class size is just right promoting conversation from pilots of various experiences and background. This being said I encourage you to get your name on the list early as her classes do fill up.

At the end of the course everyone taking this as a CFI Refresher took a required test which gets corrected to 100%. If memory serves me correct you need to get an 80% first. You leave with your Certificate you take to the local FSDO for your renewal, a binder, a spiral bound book and yet more hand outs, circulars and tips.

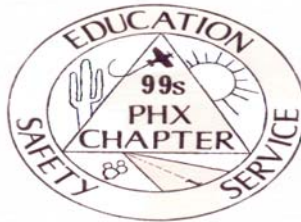
